Cost of Maintaining a County Agricultural Agent

An appropriation of \$1700 by the county court for the purpose of paying one-half the salary, traveling and office expenses of a county agricultural agent would cost each tax payer less than 7 cents per \$1000 of assessed valuation. The Linn County portion of the state money used to duplicate such appropriation would amount to \$50.

It is, of course, hard to express in dollars and cents the amount of benefit a county derives from the services of a county agricultural agent but many instances are on record where they have saved their salary for a year by one line of work alone. There is an instance of this in Yamhill County this year. County Agent Shrock personally advised and aided 19 farmers in building home made silos at an average saving of \$88.00 or a total of \$1672. His salary is \$1600.

In 1913 the year before a county agent was employed, Tillamook County spent \$4300 in two months paying bounties for gophers and moles. Last year Crook County was practically cleared of jackrabbits in a two month's poisoning campaign, carried on under the direction of the county agent and an expert from the U. S. Bureau of Biology. 65,000 jackrabbits were killed at an expense of about \$400 for poison, due to organized effort with a capable leader in the person of county agricultural agent. Several sections of Malheur County were also cleared of rabbits last season under the direction of the county agent, without other help.
