ZUNI INDIANS UNCHANGED.

Our Only Tribe Still Practically In Its Aboriginal State.

The Zuni Indians are the best examples in existence of the Indian in his aboriginal state. They live in Zuni, which is the largest Pueblo village there is. It is on the western boundary of New Mexico, not more than forty miles southwest of Fort Wingate.

These Zuni Indians are the same Zunis you might have come in contact with way back in the days of their early beginning. The big anthropologist of the University of California believes they are practically unchanged. No one knows how long they have been in existence, for the first that we white people know of them is when they were discovered by the Spanish explorers in 1539.

Later the missionaries tried to win them over, but every trace of a Spaniard and a missionary was wiped out of their lives with the great Pueblo revolt of 1680.

They live in their aboriginal state, with the same customs and costumes, and they weave the same patterns in their baskets and blankets, and they mold and make the same kind of pottery and use the same designs and the same sort of dye as they have been using for generations and generations and centuries.

The houses are adobe or stone, perched up on high mesas, safe from the attack of the enemy, whoever the enemy may be. The Zunis have communal houses, with square rooms, trap doors and ladders for stairs and skins for window glass.

Cooking stoves and electric light and the telephone have not been accepted by the Zunis, but they have and even enjoy their sewing machines and a washing machine. How these broke in upon them is a mystery.

The language of the Zuni remains Zuni and is free and untainted by our English or the Spanish. Their religious rites and ceremonials are held to as firmly as they were held to when they first came into being, and they are performed with as much ardor.

Family life is still based upon the clan system, and the ruler of the household is the woman.—San Francisco Chronicle.
