Oregon Development News in Line of Industries, Payrolls, and Products of Labor and Enterprise.

Oregon Legislature Shows Every Inclination to Eliminate Freak and Radical Legislation and Hold taxes Down to a Minimum. This Will Be a Great Encouragement to Industry.

Goshen—S P Co purchases and deeds parcel of land to county highway eliminating dangerous crossing.

North Bend—Preliminary work begun on paving waterfront highway.

Astoria—Port Commission to build new dredge. Will improve Shippagan River.

Eugene will have cheese factory if quantity of milk is available.

Gresham—Fruit cannery to be rebuilt, to also handle vegetables.

Improvements on North Bank, Oregon Electric, Oregon Trunk, and United Railways lines for last 12 months have totaled \$500,000.
