schools in many places in the county.

The industrial work and individual fairs, the community meetings for the discussion of practical questions, have all been originated by the present incumbent. The supervisory law, by many not understood, is in the hands of a board and is being carried out at an expense of one less than the number of supervisors provided by law, making the administration of the office the lowest in the state considering the number of schools.

The county superintendent has under his supervision, about 250 teachers and an influence over more than 8000 children and, in addition, the expenditure of more than \$150,000 annually of the people's money. As this is a position of so grave importance to the welfare of the children in the schools of Linn county, I have been constrained as one who has given this question serious consideration to submit the foregoing facts to the voters.

I trust that the same will meet your approval and find space in your valuable paper.
