interest in the welfare of the state that such men will permit the sacrifice of their time and money. These burdensome laws are being felt, not only in the state as a whole, but in our counties and municipalities as well. For instance, one hotel man in this state furnished a list of inspectors who made inspections of various departments in his hotel as follows:

Building Inspector,
Electric "
Sidewalk "
Water "
Sanitary "
Game "
Milk "
Labor "
Welfare "
License "
Dance Hall "

This list does not include representatives of the national government, the sheriff, police nor fire departments.

I favor the abolishment of the law permitting school text books to be changed every six years.

I believe that the law authorizing school supervisors in each county should be amended so that the county could decide by majority vote whether it desires a supervisor or not.

The principal objection to our direct primary law is that it does not provide for representation in sparsely settled districts as against the more densely populated sections. To overcome this objectionable feature, I favor dividing the county in three districts for the purpose of nominating county commissioners and also representatives to the legislature. This would be for nominating purposes only, as the elective power could not be changed without an amendment to our state constitution. By this means each section of the county would have a representative in both our county and state affairs. This plan would represent the county as a whole more intelligently and more effectively, than is the case at present and should be adopted.

I am opposed to any change in the location of our state university, as the cost would be too great to justify any advantage that might be gained by such move.

I do not favor the establishment of any additional courts to handle the judicial business of the state at the expense of the taxpayers.

In conclusion permit me to say that I shall discuss more fully from time to time the measures referred to in this article, as well as some others omitted for lack of space.

My purpose is to address the voters both from the platform and through the press, realizing that these measures can be gained only by an open and positive course and that no decisive action ever lacked the disapproval of those of opposite views.
