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tive rather indicates that the commission is too friendly, both with the bond buyers and the Warren Construction Co. However, this conclusion can be nothing but a surmise. Yet the old weather worn Biblical law "By their fruits shall ye know them" seems applicable.

But let us suppose a commission had been appointed which would have looked after the interests of the people rather than those of the Warren people and the bond buyers. It would not have sold a bond except at par and when the war made labor scarce and high priced would have suspended paying operations until conditions were again normal.

But this program was not just what Portland people wanted. The prime purpose of bonds was to build the Columbia highway for the enjoyment of Portland auto joy riders.
