He is sarcastic but lacks the flow of words to express his petty personal dislikes in a manner that carries conviction. Scott was more or less of an aristocrat but he was a born bourbon. He was no counterfeit gentleman. Piper has the veneer of a man of letters but it is of the superficial, transparent, made-to-measure kind. Scott was exclusive but no one ever accused him of being a snob. He was a staunch republican but at rare intervals had the saving grace of being able to detect ability in those who failed to accept his school of political philosophy.
