12 WAR TANKS TO ADVERTISE VICTORY LOAN

Each Pacific Coast State to
Get at Least One Tank to
Aid Fifth Drive

Twelve tanks which have been assigned to the Twelfth Federal Reserve District for use during the Victory Liberty Loan drive opening April 21 have been assigned to the seven states in the district so that each state in the district will get at least one of the tanks to display during the campaign. The tanks have been assigned as follows: Two to Washington, one to Oregon, one to Idaho, one to Utah, one to Nevada, two to Northern California and two to Southern California and Arizona. The remaining two tanks are to be carried on special trophy trains which will tour the district.

Tanks in Sham Battle

Veterans of the American Expeditionary Forces who have seen actual service in France will be the drivers of the tanks during the campaign. Before being distributed throughout the district for the opening of the campaign the tanks will parade in San Francisco and give a sham battle.

All of the tanks are being shipped from the East direct to San Francisco. They are due to arrive there about April 6 when they will be taken to a four acre tract near the Southern Pacific freight yards and assembled by the men who are to drive them. Each of the tanks will be armed with a Marlin machine gun or 37 M.M. smoke bombs with special pistols and lights.

Display of War Relics

In addition to the tanks the special trophy trains will carry a complete display of relics which have been gathered on the battlefields of France and which have been shipped back to this country since the signing of the armistice. Accompanying each of the trains will be an American war hero who will speak for the Victory Loan. One of the trains will tour the North west and the other will travel through California and the Southwest.

VICTORY DRIVE MEDALS

Medals made from captured German cannon will be awarded by the Treasury Department to volunteer workers who take part in the Victory Liberty Loan drive for \$5,000,000,000 which will start April 21.

Inscribed on the face of the medal will be the name of the worker and the service for which the medal was awarded.

BONELESS BEEF SAVES U. S. ARMY \$73,000 DAILY

War Department Cuts Ex-
penses on Meat Shipments
for the A. E. F.

Thousands of tons of boneless beef was shipped to the American Expeditionary Forces in order to cut the cost of transportation and save valuable freight space. This is only one of scores of ways in which the government eliminated unnecessary expense in the endeavor to make every dollar raised through the four popular Liberty Loans go as far as possible.

By shipping all meat for the overseas troops with the bones cut out at the packing houses in America it has been estimated that a saving of \$73,000 daily was made. The suggestion to ship the meat in this economical manner was made by an army man after he watched thousands of tons go forward by the old method. A carcass of beef contains twenty-five pounds of bone to every hundred pounds of meat and requires twice the shipping space. It is with such unanswerable arguments as these that the government is replying to the charges that money was carelessly spent during the war making necessary the calling of the Victory Loan.

REOPEN PRIVILEGE FOR CONVERSION OF LIBERTY BONDS

Indefinite Extension of Time
Granted by Secretary Glass
on Earlier Loans.

The privilege of converting Liberty Loan bonds of the first and second issues into bonds of the later issues bearing a higher rate of interest which expired November 5, 1918, has been reopened by the secretary of the Treasury for an indefinite period, which may be ended at such date as may be fixed by the secretary on six months' public notice. This conversion privilege applies to 4 per cent bonds of the first and second issues into 4 1/2 per cent bonds.

The conversion may be made by surrendering the bonds now held to the Federal Reserve Bank at San Francisco, accompanied by a "request for conversion," on an application blank which will be mailed from the Federal Reserve Bank.
