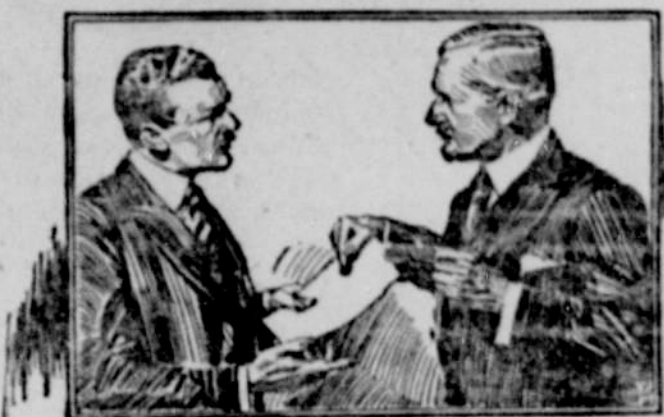


## Just Where and How Is the Money to be Spent?



*A businesslike Answer to  
a businesslike Question*

**T**HIRTY denominations cooperating in the Interchurch World Movement have budgeted their needs. No business could have done it more scientifically.

They have united to prevent the possibility of duplication or waste. At least a million dollars will be saved by the fact that thirty individual campaigns are joined in one united effort.

Each denomination has arranged its budget under six main heads:

**1 FOR THE CHURCH'S WORK AT HOME.** A score of millions come under this head. Consider only one. Five and a half million people in the United States cannot even read and write the English language. Who is to carry forward this vast work of Americanization if the church does not?

**2 FOR HOSPITALS AND HOMES.** Every year thousands of men and women seriously ill are turned away from Church hospitals because of lack of room. The children's homes are compelled to turn away more children than they can receive.

**3 FOR HIGHER EDUCATION.** Of the 450,000 American students in institutions of higher grade, one-half are in institutions founded and supported by the churches. Many of these institutions have had no great endowment campaigns, but their needs are just as pressing as the needs of larger schools, and you have only to read their list of alumni and alumnae to measure the value of their contribution to America.

**4 FOR RELIGIOUS TRAINING AT ABROAD.** Influences come first from the Orient thirty years ago, nearly all plagues are Oriental plagues. So long as China has only one physician to every 400,000 people the Orient will continue to be a menace. So long as one-third of the babies of India die before their second year our own babies are not safe. A Christian doctor or teacher sent abroad is working for America as truly as though he worked at home.

**5 FOR THE CHURCH'S WORK ABROAD.** Influences come first from the Orient thirty years ago, nearly all plagues are Oriental plagues. So long as China has only one physician to every 400,000 people the Orient will continue to be a menace. So long as one-third of the babies of India die before their second year our own babies are not safe. **6 PREACHERS' SALARIES.** The preacher is called the "forgotten man," and well he may be. Eight out of ten preachers are paid less than \$20 a week!

## The INTERCHURCH World Movement of North America

The students of Baker high school have purchased a new, high-class motion-picture machine and have booked a long series of excellent film productions, which will be projected upon the screen in the high school auditorium one evening in every week.

Robbers broke into the vault of the Scio State bank at Scio and escaped with an unknown quantity of Liberty bonds, War Savings Stamps and some cash secured from rifling the contents of boxes, which may total as high as \$50,000. No attempt was made to open the main safe.

A questionnaire is being sent to all the high school principals in the state by Dr. John Landsbury, dean of the school of music of the State University, in an attempt to gain their cooperation in making high school credits in music worthy of being rated as university entrance credits.

With national leaders present, and a great majority of the Baptist minister of the state in attendance, Baptist leaders met at the White Temple in Portland to formulate plans for the nation-wide campaign for \$100,000,000. Oregon's apportionment of this fund will be \$1,450,000, it was announced.

Because Oregon and California face an "unprecedented shortage of water for either hydroelectric power or irrigation purposes," the Geary Investment corporation of Oregon, and the California-Oregon Power company, a

California corporation, will bury the hatchet this year and allow water storage in the Upper Klamath lake.

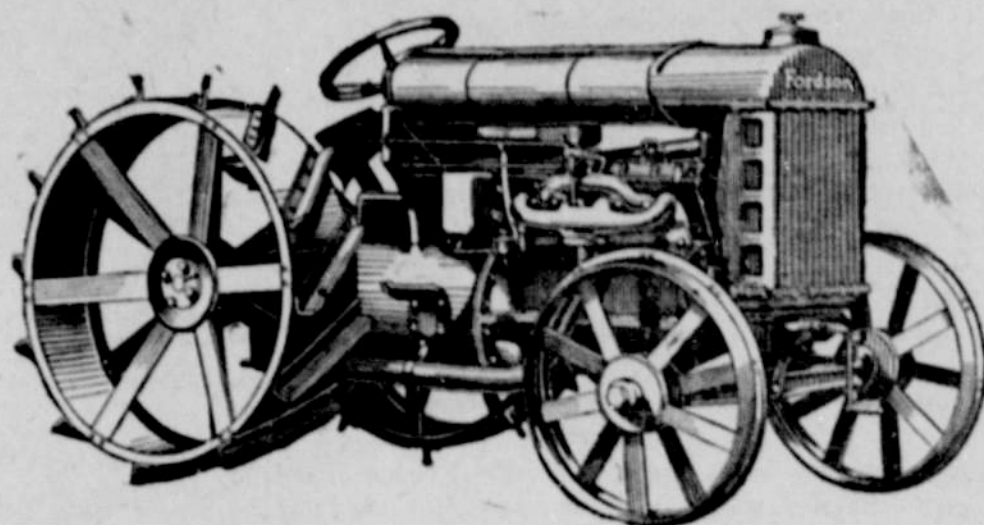
Approximately 400 acres of worthless swamp land in Douglas county will be made worth between \$300 and \$400 per acre by the new drainage project outlined by Professor C. F. Johnson, drainage expert of the Oregon Agricultural college, and County Agent C. J. Hurd. The lands are situated in the Looking Glass and Yoncalla valleys.

The Oregon State Bar association, through its grievance committee, has filed proceedings in the supreme court asking that George A. Hall, an attorney of Portland, and John N. Seivers, an attorney with offices at Oregon City, be disbarred from practicing their profession in Oregon.

Pine Valley residents are making another effort to divide Baker county. It is proposed to cut off what is called the Panhandle, once a part of Union county but later annexed to Baker, and form a new county. The great distance from the Panhandle to Baker, the county seat, is the source of dissatisfaction.

Reports from the Long Creek and Muddy Creek districts in Baker county are to the effect that a second winter is being experienced, and hay is becoming so scarce that there is likely to be a severe loss of stock if the winter lasts much longer. Because of the snow, all farm work has been discontinued.

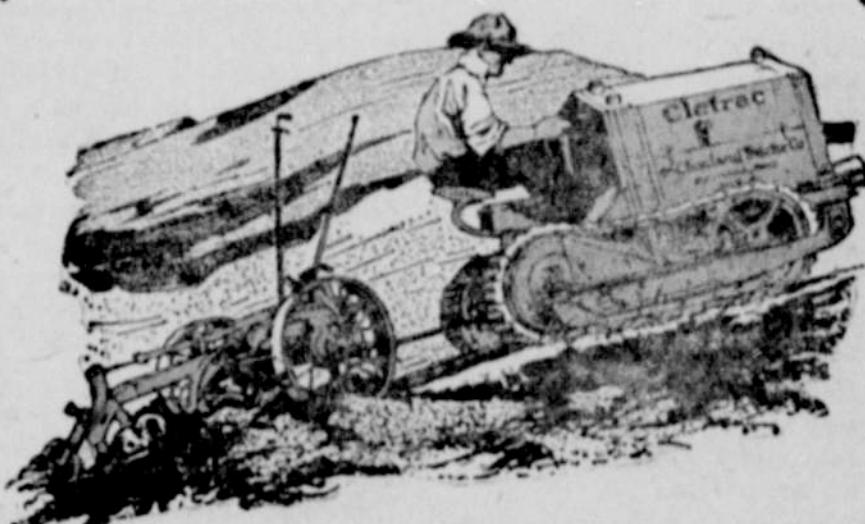
