

Notice of Annual School Meeting.

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of School District No. 95 of Linn County, State of Oregon, that the annual school and tax meeting will be held at the school house, Scio, Oregon, at 2:00 o'clock, P. M., on June 21, 1920, for the purpose of electing one director and clerk, and to vote on the proposition of levying a special district tax. The total amount of money needed by the district during the fiscal year beginning June 21, 1920, and ending June 20, 1921, is estimated in the following budget:

The amount of money to be raised by this special tax is more than the amount raised by special school district tax in the year immediately preceding this, plus six per cent. It is necessary to raise this additional amount by special levy for the following reason: Increase in teachers' salaries.

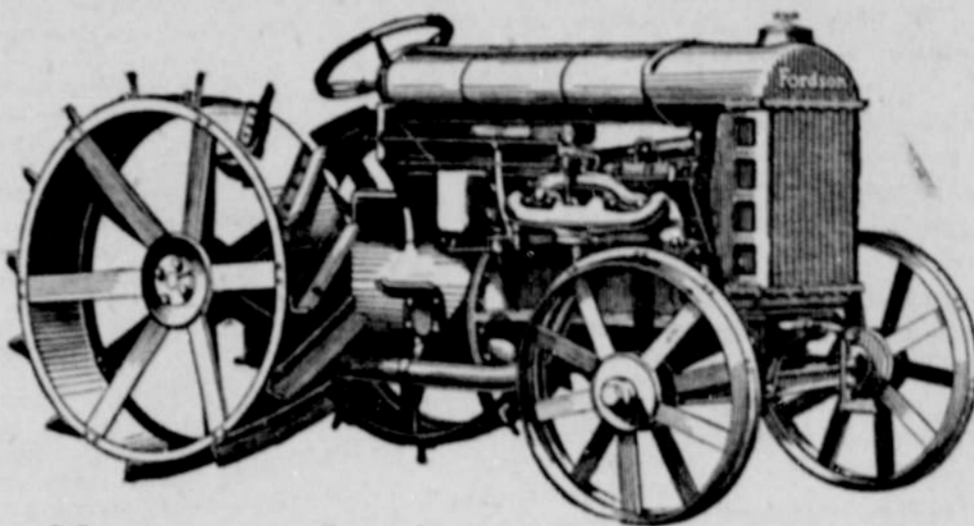
