Prof. Ruth, of the O. A. C., and A. C. Heyman, county agent, were at the S. F. Zysset farm, about 2 miles southwest of Scio, Saturday, where they inspected 18 acres of side oats for proper certification of same as seed oats, under the certified seed project of the Linn county farm bureau.

C. R. Evans, of Lake Creek, also had a two and a half acre field of eclipse oats inspected for certification, which has been passed as o. k. by Prof. Hyslop, of the O. A. C., but the field of Mr. Zysset failed to stand the test.

Dr. G. D. Loder is examining the cattle of Linn county for tuberculosis and finds them singularly free from the disease.

Stop! Look! Listen!

It will be remembered that the Tax Liberator sometime ago fathered the suggestion that we impose a gasoline tax for the sole purpose of maintaining our state highways. The idea immediately met with popular approval and the law was made effective, taxing each gallon of gasoline sold in the state 2 cents for such purpose. The income from our automobile licenses and from this gasoline tax when secured was immediately capitalized and the state issued bonds in contemplation of this income, but for construction purposes only. Many miles of splendid highway have been built to the benefit of the citizens of the entire state. The road building program contemplates additional construction of hard surfaced roads. We are, however, entirely ignoring the fact that the roads that have been built are gradually becoming more and more in need of proper maintenance and upkeep. This is a most serious oversight. We might just as well not build good roads if we are going to permit them to go back and to ruin. Without any further delay steps should be taken that the necessary amount be set aside each year for maintenance. If this is not done it will only be a question of months until the traffic of the state will be bumping over roads as bad as existed before the hard surfacing was put in on many miles of what are now well paved roads, the pride of the citizens of the state and the joy of the motorist.

A maintenance fund must be created at once and kept intact from now on if we are not to suffer a waste of the millions of dollars already spent for good roads and highways.—Tax Liberator.
