DAIRY FACTS

QUALITY OF MARKET BUTTER

Department of Agriculture Offers Commission Man Court of Last Resort.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

In the past buttermakers have often been in the dark as to the real quality of the butter they put upon the market, and frequently they feel that they have not been fairly treated by commission men and others in the markets. But the creamery man is not without friends, for the United States Department of Agriculture offers him

an inspection service that stands almost as a court of last resort. Any person who wants this service may have it by applying for it. The government inspectors examine butter in cans, in storage, or in stores, and the certificates they issue stand in court, but they seldom get that far, as they are almost universally accepted.

At the National Dairy show, which was held in St. Paul, Minn., October 8 to 15, butter inspectors showed how they do their work, and exhibits that have been prepared by the department showed the great advantage that comes from marketing butter of a high grade. On the face of it butter that scores 88 would not seem to be much inferior to that which scores 92, but it was shown that the spread of price between those two grades is very large, far greater than the difference in cost of manufacture. As Poor Richard might have said: "A little better butter makes a much bigger bank balance."

Common and Preferred Stock.

Holders of preferred stock are entitled to dividends in advance of common stock holders, and also to a claim on the property ahead of the common stock. The customary way is to provide for a limited dividend on preferred stock, which must be paid before common stock holders are entitled to any profits.

Value Of Pure Bred Dairy Cattle

Oregon is rapidly coming to the front as the dairy center of the world and this is largely due to the increased number of pure-bred dairy cattle.

It is not my intention to advance any particular breed, as that should be left to the individual himself. All the leading dairy breeds have proven themselves adaptable to the Willamette Valley, therefore anyone will not go wrong in choosing the breed that strikes his particular fancy.

If you will pardon a personal reference, I will give a brief account of my ten years' experience in the pure-bred game and what I have done with the Jerseys may easily be accomplished by anyone else, with the breed of his choice and with proper care.

In April 1912, I purchased nine registered Jersey cows and one bull for \$2245.00, while at different times during the ten years I have purchased eight heifers and two bulls for \$1640.00, making a total spent for pure-breds \$3885.00, while during the same period I have disposed of pure-bred cattle to the amount of \$8,077.00 and have on hand at the present time eighteen head of cows and heifers and three bulls, valued at more than \$5,000.00. During the same ten years I have sold butterfat to the amount of \$16,076.00, exclusive of the cream and butter used at home.

I will just say in passing that when I bought the cattle, I was in debt \$2,000.00 on my 55-acre farm so when I went further in debt for the cattle the neighbors must have thought I had lost my mind, but the cattle have paid for themselves with interest and also the debt on my farm, besides paying for an additional 25 acres at \$3,600.00 and the erection of our dairy barn and equipment.

I am laying no claim on any exceptional ability in handling the cattle so my advice to every dairyman in this vicinity is: choose the breed you like best, buy the best you can can and breed better. Take care of your stock and success is assured.

ASCERTAIN RECORD OF BULL

When Making Purchase Insist Upon Knowing Yearly Milk Production of Its Dam.

When buying a bull insist upon knowing the yearly milk production of his dam and the average per cent of butterfat. A seven-day record is of little value in determining the actual dairy worth of a cow, for by good handling it is possible to greatly increase her percentage of butterfat.

Cow Has One Purpose.

A dairy cow has one purpose, which is to produce, and this the cows of the recognized dairy breeds do more profitably.

Keep Fire in Tank-Heater.

Ice water is fine in summer, but keep the stock from it in winter by keeping a fire in the tank-heater.

Barnyard Manure.

Haul out that manure and spread it on your fields. It will pay you well for the time and trouble.
