"U. S. Boys Puzzle Miss McCormick," says a newspaper headline. That's nothing, as they have been puzzling us old timers for many years. They are the best in the world.

SENATOR McNARY has been given the job of investigating the prices of gasoline and other petroleum products. Our opinion is that all these investigations result in increased prices, because they are expensive and somebody has to pay the bill. We don't need investiga-

tions, unless they find the cost of production and then the limit of profit that can be levied is established. Investigations in the past have been failures and it is reasonable to predict this one will fail.

WITH guns thundering, Amundsen, the great explorer, set sail for the far north Saturday afternoon from Seattle. Probably no other explorer in modern times has given the world so much knowledge of the universe as has Amundsen, and the rousing send-off given him was entirely appropriate.

A BIG fire at Sheridan, Oregon, Saturday morning done damage to the amount of over \$100,000, 11 business houses being almost wiped out. The McMinnville fire department responded to the call for help and materially assisted in saving the whole business section from destruction. In 1913 Sheridan suffered a \$350,000 fire.

Scio businessmen advertised special bargains for last Saturday, on staple standard goods that are used every day, and they claim the price quoted was below wholesale price. They claim the people do not want bargains, or else they do not know what bargains are. The Scio merchants are square and their specials should be grabbed up, for they are bargains.

THE newspaper is becoming more and more the logical medium for national advertisers, said Thomas L. Emery, Pacific Coast manager of the American Newspaper Publishers' Association, who was in Portland recently on a business trip from San Francisco, his headquarters. As indication of this he pointed to increased appropriations allotted by big advertisers for newspaper advertisements.

CHARLES HALL, a recent candidate in the republican primaries for the nomination for governor, has intimated that if he fails in his contest he will probably be an independent candidate in the November election. This threat proves that Hall and his followers are poor sportsmen, and if elected he would be a "sissy" in a man's job. It measures up with his announcement letter early in the campaign that he was having his announcement story put in plate form and asked the country papers to run it, and he would later run an ad in the paper. Most editors fell for the "gush," but he conveniently forgot his promise. This paper felt all the time he was not the man for the place, and recent events proves its feelings were correct. We need men (he men) in positions of such responsibility, and Hall is not such a man.
