Cherry Slugs are Busy

Pear and cherry slugs are appearing on the foliage of these trees and are skeletonizing the leaves in characteristic fashion. Growers who experienced serious defoliation from this pest last season may control it by spraying the trees now with arsenate of lead, 2 pounds to the hundred gallons.—O. A. C.

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
