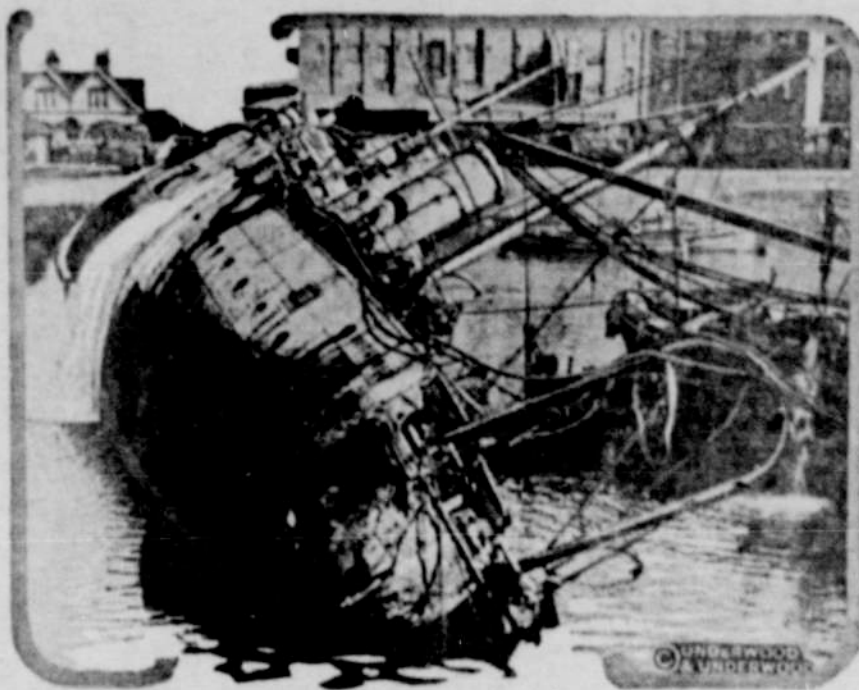


Sunken Sloop Being Salvaged
