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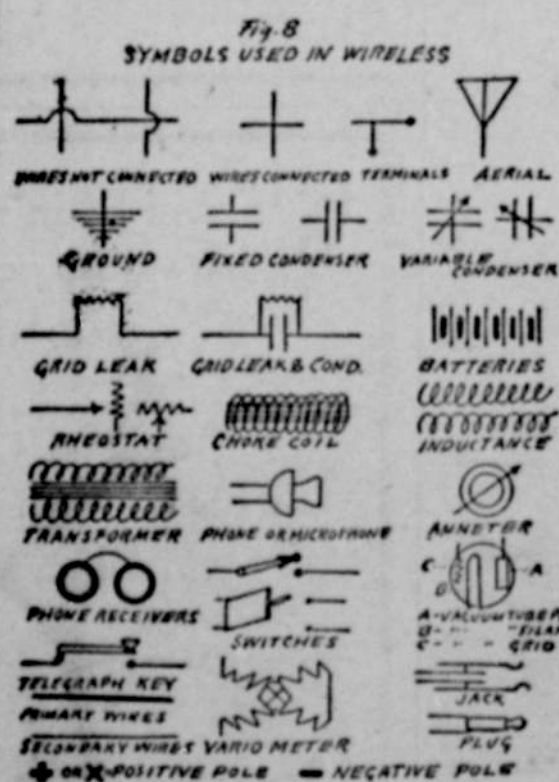
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THE HOME RADIO

How to Make and Use It By A. HYATT VERRILL

V. READING DIAGRAMMS

Most people who have not made a study of radio telegraphy or other branches of electricity are puzzled when they look at the diagrams for wiring that are supplied in many books, magazines or catalogues. These seldom have the various appliances or accessories marked by name or letter, and, to the uninitiated, they are practically meaningless. It is very easy to understand these, however, once you have learned what the various symbols mean, and everyone interested in radio telephony should learn them. In the accompanying cut, Fig. 8, the common symbols used in diagrams of wireless apparatus are shown and anyone can learn and memorize these in a short time.
