Holiday Rates Reduced

Reduced holiday excursion fares will be put into effect by the Southern Pacific for Christmas and New Year's Holidays. The reduced rates, which will be in effect between all points on Southern Pacific lines where the one-way fare is \$30 or less, will consist of one and one-half fare for the round trip or 25 per cent reductions from the double one-way fare.

Tickets will be on sale December 22, 23, 24, 25, 29, 30, 31 and January 1, with final return limit January 3.
