Both were unsuspected by Sheriff Richard until he was returning from a conference with J. E. Roy, a former deputy, at the court house and discovered Parker in the jail yard. Johnson had made his get-away and is still at large, but Parker was returned to jail and a cell, in which both should have been all these weeks with an Oregon boot on besides. Trial for first degree murder against these culprits is scheduled for Monday, July 16.

We would like to say what we really think about allowing prisoners of the Johnson and Parker calibre the freedom of the corridors, but will say we think it a mighty loose way to protect person and property against men who care for committing murder as little as all of us do in killing a fly. Two dead sheriffs seems no lesson to the live one. The county has offered \$500 reward for the capture of Johnson.
