1---How much grain will I thresh?

2---How much will I need for feed until next harvest?

3---How much will I have to sell?

4---Should I sell at the opening harvest market?

5---Should I sell enough to pay my bills and store the balance in a warehouse?

or

6---Should I store all my surplus in a warehouse and borrow money on my warehouse receipt to meet my bills?
