Mrs. Lillian Alice Miller, 65, was found dead in her bed at her home in North Albany Friday night. Heart failure is believed to be the cause.

No blackberries will be bought by the Albany canneries this year as it is reported the cannery will not run any more this season.

N. J. Russel and Bernice Snell, aged 8, of Wichita, Kans. came near being drowned in the rapids of the Santiam river near Lebanon Friday afternoon. When a raft made of railroad ties on which they were riding capsized, throwing them into 12 feet of water. Both would have been drowned but for the heroic work of Rev. Ford, Baptist minister, who was one of the party.

Most of the poles for the 11,000 volt transmission line being built by the Mountain States Power Company between Albany and Lebanon have been set and unless there is a delay in getting materials the line will be ready for juice this week.

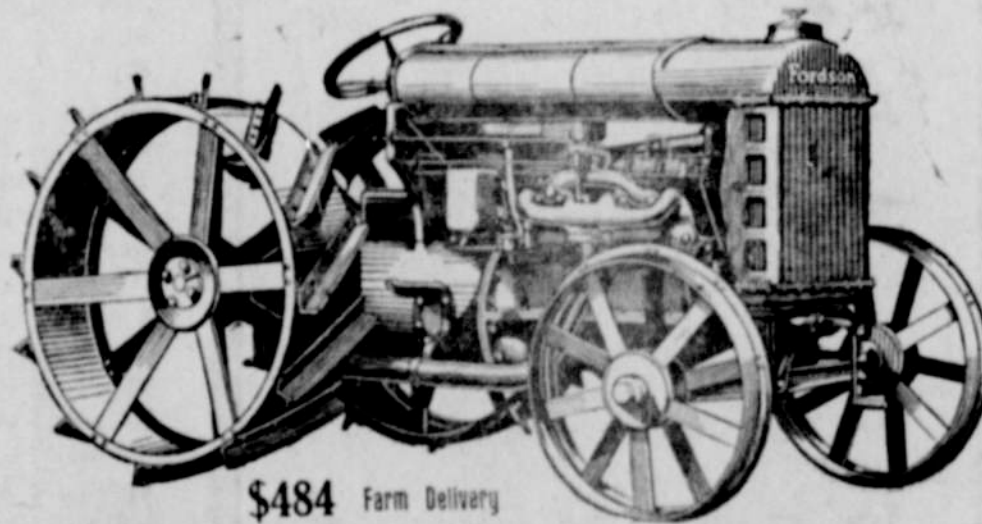
