It is to be hoped that the police will look carefully to enforcing the traffic regulations and that no sympathy will be shown to motor speed artists.

The Time Of The Critical Test.

All indications point to the advent of better business. Depression has given way to confidence. Business has come through one of the most critical periods in history. In other times business has suffered from depression and from many other conditions that threatened its very life, but never until the past few years has there been such world-wide business hardship, with the whole world in much the same condition. Even now when a firmer basis has been established, the time has not arrived when the business man may rest easy. There are problems just as serious now as there were immediately following the war. The buying public has taken an other stand. It is pitting its knowledge against that of the business man. It is searching down deep into the underlying principles of business and of the business man. It is trying him at the bar of justice and fair dealing. It is demanding now—demanding that the business man deliver a product according to the value the public places upon it. This value is of the highest standard. The public demands full value for every cent it spends.

Resolutions Adopted

The agricultural department of the Portland chamber of commerce has adopted the following resolutions:—Whereas, this meeting of bankers, business men, and farmers was called for the purpose of conferring with Hon. Eugene Meyer and Hon. Frank W. Mondell, of the war Finance Corporation, who are visiting the Northwest, at the request of the president, in order to obtain first-hand information regarding the wheat situation; and whereas, we deeply appreciate the interest of president Coolidge in agricultural conditions in the great northwest, as evidenced by the presence here today of Mr. Mondell; and whereas, the interesting and instructive addresses of Mr. Meyer and Mr. Mondell clearly emphasized the fundamental importance and necessity of aiding and encouraging the cooperative marketing of wheat on a state wide scale, and especially of bringing about a closer relationship and better understanding between the country banker and soundly organized and properly managed cooperative marketing associations;

Now therefore be it resolved; that this meeting heartily indorses the principals of cooperative marketing on a commodity basis, and the chairman, as president of the Oregon Banker Association, is authorized and requested to appoint a committee of five bankers, the membership of which may be enlarged at his discretion, to cooperate with the committee recently formed in Chicago, of which ex-governor Lowden is chairman, together with other farm organizations, to study and promote the cooperative marketing of wheat on a state wide scale; and to actively assist in bringing about a better understanding and closer relationship between county bankers and the cooperative marketing movement in this state.
