Pneumonia, A Complication OF Measles

Is measles a serious disease? Judged by the carelessness and indifference with some parents allow their children to be exposed, it would appear to be harmless. The popular idea is that "Willie must have the measles some day, as it is one of the children's diseases, and the sooner he has it the better."

This idea is obsolete and has proved to be a fallacy. In the first place Willie doesn't have to have measles any more than he has to have cholera or bubonic plague. In the second place it has been shown that most of the deaths from measles occur before the sixth year. It is also true that more deaths occur from measles than from any other infectious disease, except tuberculosis.

The death rate from measles in the United States is about 14 per 100,000 population. In the U. S. Army in 1918 there were 38,846 cases of measles and 1,144 deaths resulted. From 2 to 3% of all cases of measles result fatally. In England in 1917 there were 10,500 deaths from the disease. Measles does not kill on account of the rash or high fever, but on account of complications. Of these the most important is pneumonia. Of 235 cases of measles occurring at Camp Cody in 1918, 77 cases or 33% developed pneumonia. Of these 42% died. About 4 1/2% of all cases of measles terminate in pneumonia, and the pneumonia resulting from measles is the most fatal of all varieties. About 11% of all pneumonia cases die, but 42% of pneumonia cases resulting from measles die.

Measles is a reportable disease. Every physician attending a case of measles is required by law to report the same to the health officer. Mothers who beg their physician not to report a case of measles are placing him in a very embarrassing position. Under the law a physician who fails to report a case of measles is subject to prosecution. When there is no attending physician the duty devolves upon the head of the family, or the institution in which the case occurs. Report your case of measles to the health officer.

O.A.C. Farm Reminders

Two vegetable crops a season and use of cover crops to maintain soils in physical and fertility conditions, are advantages of irrigating the vegetable garden. Quality and size are improved by water at the right time. It will enable the growing of one crop at least not in competition with general growers, insuring a good market. Irrigation crops hit the market both earlier and later than unwatered crops.

Egg size and shape is inherited. Gradual selection of those birds which in addition to a large number also lay "selects" will in time eliminate the birds laying the lower grade eggs.

Egg shell color does not effect the food value of eggs but it does make a difference in the appearance. All brown or all white eggs will command the highest prices. Range and exercise is especially desirable for poultry breeding stock.

Six roosters with each 100 hens should give good fertile eggs with Leghorns.

New Assistant Passenger Traffic Manager

C. L. McFaul, general passenger agent, has been appointed assistant passenger traffic manager for the Pacific System of the Southern Pacific Company. Announcement of the promotion of Mr. McFaul and its approval by President Wm. Sproule is made by J. H. R. Parsons, passenger traffic manager.

Mr. McFaul is succeeded as general passenger agent in San Francisco by F. C. Lathrop, who has been assistant general passenger agent.

L. Richardson, who has been district freight and passenger agent at San Francisco.

F. S. Howard of the general passenger department in San Francisco, also was named as an assistant general passenger agent.

Mr. McFaul began his service with the Southern Pacific in July 1892, as a telegraph operator on Coast Division. He held various positions until September 1904 when he was appointed city freight and passenger agent at San Jose. In 1913 he was transferred to Salt

Lake City as district freight and passenger agent. He remained there until in 1916 when he was transferred to Fresno. Mr. McFaul in 1920 was appointed as general agent at Chicago, where he remained until August of this year when he was appointed general passenger agent at San Francisco.

Mr. Lathrop entered the service of the Southern Pacific in 1903 as a passenger agent and later was appointed city passenger agent in San Francisco. He was appointed to the position of assistant general passenger agent in July 1915, serving in that capacity until his present promotion.
