wnich is located about a mice weat of Nevberg. Mr. Haskins has just received a shipment of twelve pair of these valuable littie animals, from W. K. Rodgers of Charlottestown, Prince Edward Isles, Canada. Dr. Browne's pair of Silver Black Fox cost him $\$ 1800.00$ and $\$ 99.00$ duty. He will have them here in a few days, he expects to raise these valuable animals. Thev are valued at from $\$ 1,000$ to $\$ 2,500$ per pair.
They litter twice a year and have from 1 to 10 pups, or average five.
The Silver Fox Industry in the U. S. and Canada is valued at over $820,000,000$ of which about $\$ 8,000$, 000 represents the U. S.
