"The Covered Wagon"

Some idea of the amount of planning required for "The Covered Wagon" which plays an engagement at the Globe theatre Albany-Thurs., Fri., and Sat., Feb. 21-22-23 can be gained from the fact that it was necessary to search nine Western States for location. The searchers went through California, Utah, Nevada, Idaho, Wyoming, Montana, New Mexico and Arizona. This was while the continuity was being prepared. The men decided what was wanted from the descriptions in the book.

As a result of this searching it was finally found necessary to film the Buffalo Hunt on Antelope Island, Great Salt Lake; the long trailing of the wagon train in Nevada and southern Utah; the gold hunting in the mountains of California, and a few scenes in Oregon and Washington. Less than half of one percent of the production was made in studio.

Among the Government authorities who cooperated were Col. J. T. McCoy, U. S. A. bringing down four tribes of Indians from their Wyoming reservations; all the public officials of the countries included in the locations; A. E. Shelton, Superintendent of the Nebraska State Historical Society for data and photographs of the Oregon Trail and Eunice G. Anderson, State Historian of Wyoming regarding Fort Bridger, and other historic forts in Wyoming. There probably has never previously been a picture involving such wide collaboration. People are still writing to Famous Players Lasky Corporation, giving bits of family history of pioneer days that they would like to see incorporated.
