Albany Suffers Big Fire

Fire of undetermined origin last
Sunday afternoon in the quarter
block between Fourth and Lyons
street and alley between Third and
Fourth streets, Albany, caused a
property loss estimated at between
\$30,000 and \$50,000. It is thought
the fire was caused by defective
wiring.

The Albany bakery, Nelson Bros.
meat market, and the Hub cleaning
works sustained the heaviest losses,
the proprietor of the bakery esti-
mating his loss on building and fix-
tures at \$43,419, with insurance
covering half the loss. Heroic work
on the part of the fire department
saved the entire block, as a high
north wind was blowing. One fire-
man was slightly injured.

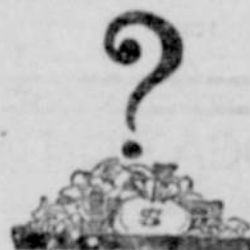
