

Stoddard Car in Mishap

G. A. Stoddard, of the Scio State Bank, met with quite a serious accident Sunday afternoon at the covered bridge near Turner. Mr. Stoddard was on his way to Jefferson, accompanied by his sisters, Misses Inez and Mae, and as they drove out of the bridge they met a Chevrolet car driven by a lady from Mill City, which collided with the Stoddard car. It is not known just how the accident occurred, but it is thought that the lady turned too far to the left of the road in trying to dodge a deep hole.

Mr. Stoddard's front axle was so badly sprung that a new one will be required, one front wheel was demolished and the right front fender

was completely ruined. Miss Mae was thrown through the top of the car and her cheek was bruised and one eye blackened. Aside from a severe fright and shakeup the others were unhurt. The Mill City car landed on the edge of the bank with one wheel hanging over the edge, and it is said that had it gone a few inches farther it would have gone into the creek.

Mr. Stoddard had to have a truck take him home. The wheels of his car have been sent to Portland to be repaired. Mr. Stoddard has only had this car about two months.

This Letter Explains Why

J. H. Mulchay, assistant freight traffic manager of the S. P. railway, after reading our editorial of June 26th about the removal of the agent at Crabtree, sends us the following letter which gives the facts leading to the withdrawal of an agency at Crabtree:

"Recently my attention was directed to an article appearing in your issue of June 26th, entitled 'Our Neglect,' subject being withdrawal of our agent at Crabtree.

"Just as a matter of information, would say that during the year 1916 we carried into Crabtree station 349 tons of less than carload freight, while during the year 1923 we only hauled 147 tons. The outbound shipments during 1916 amounted of 91 tons and in 1923 24 tons, or a grand total of in- and outbound merchandise of 440 tons in 1916 and 171 tons in 1923. Decrease of 269 tons.

"During that period, we know that the business of the merchants at Crabtree and vicinity has increased materially, yet the railroad company's freight as well as passenger business has been rapidly declining. In the face of these circumstances, removal of the agent was inevitable because the station did not pay expenses."
