**A BENEFACTOR DIES**

It was in 1894 that E. Wood Haynes  
 built and drove through the streets  
 of an Indiana town what is said to  
 have been the first gasoline auto  
 produced in America. "Get the  
 danged thing off the road" they  
 yelled at him as they struggled to  
 hold their frightened horses. Haynes  
 probably laughed at the competition,  
 for he could doubtless see ahead to  
 the years when such remarks would  
 never again be heard. And all that  
 he foresaw came true before his  
 death just a few weeks ago. He  
 lived to see the day when there is  
 an auto for every two families in  
 the country and when at least one  
 out of every 15 workers finds em-  
 ployment in connection with the  
 manufacture, sale, repair or opera-  
 tion of autos. Henry Ford popular-  
 ized the automobile, but it was E-  
 wood Haynes who first gave it to the  
 world, a fact which school teachers  
 should not lose sight of when they  
 are teaching our boys and girls the  
 good things that men have done for  
 the world.

**THE STRANGER KNOWS**

Scio citizens may not noticed it,  
 but a local paper is one of the first  
 things a stranger calls for when he  
 visits a town with a view to locating  
 in it permanently. If the paper is  
 filled with live ads, then he knows  
 there is business in that town. If it  
 is not, he knows that it must be  
 either that the home merchants have  
 little to sell or that they doubt their  
 own ability to sell it. Then he con-  
 cludes that the community is either  
 dead or hard up—and he decides to  
 locate elsewhere. This is not theory  
 —it is a statement based on many  
 years contact with people who have  
 expressed themselves along the above  
 lines. The local newspaper is an ac-  
 curate business barometer, and no
