VEAL SHIPMENTS GROWING

The express business is growing steadily now, and business in general is better than for many moons.

Oregon potato growers working for seed certification find it best to join the inspector in making field examinations. Weak, diseased and off-type vines are pointed out by the college extension specialists to be dug and removed from the field. Disease may otherwise be spread rapidly from plant to plant until much of the field is disqualified. Failure to do the roguing at these times will cause rejection of the field.
