A New Law Without Teeth

During the first month of school, teachers in the elementary grades, or the principal, must make an examination and report to parents as to defects of vision, hearing, breathing, dentition or other external obvious physical defects which will prevent or interfere with the normal education of the child. The examination is not medical, and the parent can prevent the same by notifying the teacher of his desire not to have the examination made.

To know the external defects of your child is worth while, and no doubt will be received by parents as a help in correcting the defects before it is too late. The law does not include high schools, but applies to all grade schools in the state.

You are not compelled to have the work done if you do not want to, nor do you have to take any one class of practitioners—you are a free lance in your choice. Because of the absence of teeth in the law it will probably be accepted.
