From fertilizers on the soil to aircraft high up in the blue, each civilized nation finds itself dependent on other nations for things it must have. The same rule applies to communities and neighbors, thus proving that we are not independent of each other.

"Halsey and Scio and Albany editorials are scrapping over which town can show the best growth of weeds." - Saturday's Albany Democrat-Herald.

While Halsey and Albany are each close contestants for first place, we know their chest will fall when we tell them that weeds grow so big here that they have to be cut down with an axe. And we should win the concrete earmuffs.

High taxes and tax exemption for public bonds is a combination to double taxes on the poor man and reduce the tax revenue for the government. Doing away with the tax exemption privilege would add greatly to taxable assets. Lowering taxes will prevent money from hiding in tax exempt bonds. Congress should take steps to repeal the tax exemption law, and if necessary for a constitutional amendment, to immediately initiate such a measure for ratification by the states.

In 1917 Oregon's per capita debt was 66c, while in 1924 it was \$49.94. While this vast difference was brought about by state aid for agricultural purposes, world war veterans aid and highway construction, it behooves us to be ever watchful lest the next seven years double the present per capita indebtedness. In taxes, most of us are paying for the sins of our fathers, so why should we continue to add onto the burden of sins our fathers left us for our children to carry. Let's do each year only what we can pay for and not go into debt.

Ellsworth Kelly and James Willos were found guilty of murder in the first degree by a jury at Salem last Monday, after deliberating 51 hours and taking 37 ballots, and will be sentenced by Judge Kelly Friday morning at 9 o'clock. Under the law governing such verdicts, hanging will be the pronouncement. Two more young men must pay the extreme penalty for taking the law into their own hands when they shot their way out of the penitentiary on Aug. 12 and Guard Sweeney was killed and two others seriously wounded. Does not this teach that obedience to law is our safety, and

that disobedience to law does bring death to the law-breaker and heartbreaks to the loved ones? Think three times before committing a foul deed and verdicts like the above will seldom occur.
