United Labor—Robert H. Cowdry of Illinois for President, W. H. T. Wakefield of Kansas for Vice President.

WASHINGTON LETTER. [From our regular correspondent.] There is likely to be enough politics in the congressional debates from now until the end of the session to please the most rabid partisan.

Members are now venturing predictions as to the length of the present session of Congress. The members of the ways and means committee expect to reach a vote on the tariff bill before the 1st of August.

With the close of the fiscal year the Treasury Department has furnished some interesting figures. The reduction of the public debt during June was \$12,428,502, and the fiscal year which closed on Saturday, June 30, it was \$118,814,000.

General Hooker of Mississippi is preparing a bill which he will soon introduce, to change the meeting of Congress from the first Monday in December to the 4th of March.

The President issued an executive order last week which was intensely interesting to Washington. It carries civil service reform almost to its limits.

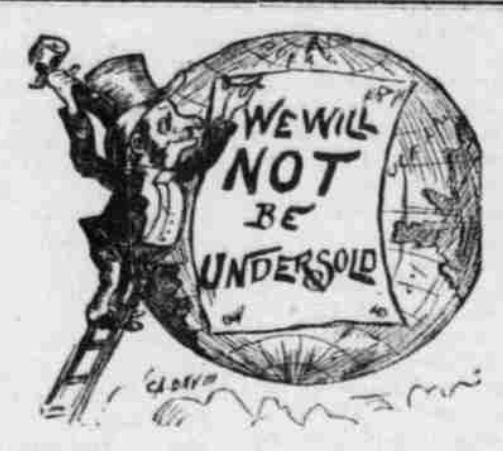
