Potato water cleans silk of any kind or color, says a housewife. For every quart of water to be used in washing a dress, for instance, pare and grate one large potato. Put the grated potatoes into the water, which must be soft water and cold; let stand two days without being disturbed in any way; then very carefully pour off the clear liquor from the sediment into a large, convenient vessel, into which dip the pieces of silk up and down. Of course the silk must not be creased by wringing it; let it hang and drip nearly dry. then lay it flat on the table and wipe it first on one side and then on the other. If necessary to press it, do so between flannel with a moderate iron.-Home Journal.
