A Humored Rival for the O. P.
J. F. Hoffman, a contractor who has been getting out ties for the Oregon Pacific, is in the city. He has just returned from a trip to the summit of the Cascade mountains, where he says a party of twenty-five surveyors, claiming to be employees of the Washah & Pacific Railroad Company, are camped and are attempting to hold the pass for their company. Mr. Hoffman talked with the men and they said they would have the road located in a short time. The road, they said, would come to Albany, and thence northwest to connect with the Astoria & Coast railroad at or near Tillamook.
As the Oregon Pacific Company's miles of track already built, it looks very much like a big snarl, although there have been some rumors afloat that the Union Pacific contemplates building a line through Eastern Oregon and across the mountains to connect with the Southern Pacific at this city.
That there is a party of surveyors of some road in the field in the locality named there is no doubt, and it might transpire that on some of these bright mornings Albany will find another big line building into the city.—Albany Herald.

Big Mining News.
A few weeks ago Charles Barnwell, working on the Oregon Pacific railroad made one of the most important discoveries of silver-lead mine yet made in the Santiam district. The vein is twenty feet wide on the surface, carries rich sulphures and carbonates and is cut right through by the railroad.
The mine is on the north fork of the Santiam only fifteen miles above the Rock Creek post-office and accessible by railroad, as the track is within seven miles of the mine and a graded number of miles beyond.
Prof. Harnett, the mining expert, says he will risk his reputation, that in less than two years it will be the Cor'd Alene of Oregon.
He says, positively, Cor'd Alene never showed such perfect surface ore as is found in the Wallowa and Santiam districts. As all the silver-lead mines are known to improve, in depth, the gentleman's predictions seem likely to be fulfilled once more.—Oregonian.
