

GOLDEN CITY.

GOLDEN CITY, OR., Aug. 15.

EDITOR EXPRESS:—On my arrival in Golden City I found that our camp had quite a boom. New mines that have been opened up during my absence show some fine prospects of fine ore that will assay away in the hundreds. Ed H. Fleming and Frank Foster, two San Francisco capitalists, have been in camp looking over Dry Gulch in view of placing in hydraulic works to sluice out the Gulch. They have taken up eight claims, 160 acres all, and intend to build a flume about ten miles long, commencing up somewhere near the meadows, and bringing the water on to the top of Little Bull mountain, building there a large reservoir. They left last night for Frisco, and will return in about two weeks with engines and a full outfit to commence work on the flume. They will ship a new mill up just as soon as they reach Frisco. They are well-known hydraulic mining men of California, and say that there are millions in the Gulch, and the finest looking quartz they have ever seen is in and around Golden City, that it will be the largest camp in the west in a year from now. A. R. Campbell and Smith have run a tunnel in their claim, Black Bear, distance twenty-four feet, and have struck very fine ore, which they say has millions in it, as it is a strong, well defined vein, and the pay vein three and a half feet wide. J. J. Van, a Tacoma man, has two very fine bridges and intends commencing work on them at once. There has been a fire in this locality, as everyone has been careful about placing out fire. We expect yet to see several hundred people in Golden City before the snow comes this fall. The Albany milling and mining company are getting out some very fine ore which I was shown today. F. W. Reed, A. A. Rhodes and Charlie Brush left for Albany this afternoon, taking out some very fine specimens of ore from their mines. The huckleberry season is about passed, but managed to get a gallon to-day. The cherries have begun to come down from the divide and are quite plentiful. E. O. Smith and several parties left about a few days ago on a prospecting party down the Yellowstons, where they expect to find some fine galena and copper mines. E.
