A young man named English has been swindling Portland merchants. He is now being given them drafts on a San Francisco house that has been dissolved.

The State Board of Agriculture has sustained the appointment of Director Hancock to look after the Los Angeles Fair. Southern California wanted a person from its section of the State.

The story that Mrs. Ferry has been robbed of a large sum of money at Portland is discredited, owing to the fact that the lady has not made the robbery public.

The San Diego grand jury says that more than \$100,000 of the county funds have been illegally spent, and recommends the removal of the county supervisors.

The body of Mr. Enos, superintendent of the San Francisco Copper Company at Campo Seco, who was drowned on the 10th inst., in one of the mine shafts, has been recovered.
