A torch of silver, from which issues flames of gold, is an oddity in scarf pins.

A wild duck with widespread wings of enamel on silver is a unique idea in brooches.

A pretty idea in scarf pins is a crab in green enamel, with claws and an edging of gold.

A Roman ax of gold, in the center of which is set an ancient Roman coin, is an odd brooch recently seen.

A pretty match box recently seen represented a half burned cigar in gold. The ashes were of oxidized silver.

Cable links of corrugated gold wire make a fashionable bracelet largely sought after by lovers of solid jewelry.

A unique idea in scarf pins is a fishing rod of gold with suspended line. On the end of the line is a small diamond.

Two fishing rods of gold, crossed and supporting in the center a fish and fish bag of the same material, are an attractive brooch.

An owl's head of Roman gold, connected by means of two links to a tree bough of the same material, does service as a cuff button.

In watches a pleasing style recently seen was a silver case shaped as a horseshoe and topped with a large bit of the same material.

A desk weight recently seen was a four-inch bear's tusk set against a large oak leaf of oxidized copper and topped by a bear's head in gilt bronze.

An acorn's husk of Etruscan gold, set in the center with a large pearl surrounded by a circle of small diamonds, is a unique idea in ear drops.

A huntsman's large horn of gold, in the center of which is the head of a fox held in place by a large hunting whip, is a neat idea in brooch designs.

A beautiful brooch recently seen was a large golden arrow, the barb of which was a mass of small diamonds, while the feather tips were set with rubies and sapphires.

Two horseshoes of platinum, held together at the center with a golden riding whip, over which lies a jockey cap of opals and diamonds, is a pretty brooch recently seen.

A series of flexible links, half of each link being made of enameled Etruscan gold and the other half of the plain material, is a design in bracelets that attracts favorable attention.

An elaborate design in paper cutters is one with a broad, heavy handle of handsomely etched oxidized silver and blade of mother of pearl, studded at different portions with small silver knobs.

The Don Quixote lead pencil is a pleasing little affair. It consists of a long golden tube, at the top of which is a miniature silver figure of the knight of the rueful countenance in full armor.

The figure of a female of silver gilt bronze, dressed in the old German style, with long, wide bottomed skirts, is the shape of a drinking cup which is being introduced as a revival of medieval fashion.

In ear drops a unique design recently seen consisted of hollowed balls of Roman gold ornamented with small flower designs in red and blue enamel, and set in a network of gold wire, which partially covered with diamonds the openings at the sides.

An extravagant idea in drinking horns, or wassal cups, is a fish of bronze, the whole body of which is covered with a series of enameled pictures representing various toasts. The fish is held aloft by a mermaid of bronze, who supports herself on the back of a large turtle by her tail of varicolored green enamel.—Jeweler's Weekly.

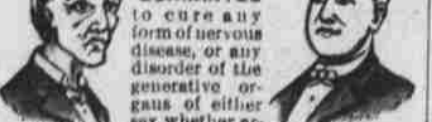
