

A NEW YEAR RESOLUTION.

Lebanon should start into the new year with the determination and a firm resolve that before the year 1890 rolls into oblation she will have a water ditch flowing through town. If all would only make one desperate effort and pull together we would have it in less than six months. Now is the time for us to get in and take up this project; other towns are whooping up their railroad enterprises, or something of that sort, and the one that offers the best inducements to workingmen is the one that will go ahead every time. We know that our citizens have done well on the paper mill. But we don't want to stop. Every dollar spent toward such enterprises will bring back two in the long run. It is a matter of investment and should be looked on as such, so let us make the start—delay is dangerous.

It is earnestly hoped that ere another New Year day arrives the people of Lebanon can look upon a water ditch rushing through our thriving city, and also see a good system of sewerage and water works in operation.

As was announced last week, the Board of Trade met Monday evening, and considerable interest was manifested. After the reading of the minutes the president appointed the following standing committees for the ensuing year:

On advertising—S. O. Wallace, H. Y. Kirkpatrick, M. A. Miller.

On finance—M. A. Miller, C. C. Hackleman.

On manufacturing—J. J. Swan, Joseph Elkins, W. B. Donaca, Chas. D. Montague, G. T. Cottan.

We believe the above-named committees will accomplish much during the year 1890.

It has been reported during the past week that the law protecting Chinese pheasants expired with the old year. But it will not be well to heed such advice, for Hill's Code, Section 1941, says the law was enacted and approved Nov. 21, 1885, and protected these birds for six years from the passage of the act, so it will be seen that the time will not expire until Nov. 21st, 1891—nearly two years hence.

State Tax Levy Made.

The state executive board, consisting of Gov. Penneyer, Secretary of State McBride, and Treasurer Webb met in the office of the latter Monday and made a levy of taxes for state purposes for the year 1890 as follows: For general expense fund, five and twenty-three-hundredths mills; university tax, one-seventh mill; military tax, one-fifth mill, making six mills in all. The net valuation of the state is \$101,529,472, a six mill tax upon which will raise a revenue of \$609,518 33, or \$574,689 19 for general expenses, \$14,512 35 for university and \$20,317 29 for military.—Salem Statesman.
