State Tax Levy Made.

The state executive board, consisting of Gov. Pennoyer, Secretary of State McBride, and Treasurer Webb met in the office of the latter Monday and made a levy of taxes for state purposes for the year 1890 as follows: For generall expense fund, five and twentythree-thirty-fifths mills; university tax, one-seventh mill; military tax, one-fifth null, making six mills in all. The net valuation of the state is \$101,-586,472; a six mill tax upon which will raise a revenue of \$600,518 23, or \$574,-589 19 for general expenses, \$14,512 a5 for university and \$20,317 29 for military .- Salem Statesman,
