Here he was more successful, for after the usual canvass the generous hearted man on the bench gave him a liberal order, and from thence he went on his way rejoicing. We also heard that certain young gentlemen like to have said—were expecting in the near future to put up a saloon on the east side of Main street. However we were unable to gain any authentic information in regard to this enterprise. We would recommend the city fathers to adopt extremely high license. The Fern Ridge school is situated one-half mile north and is progressing nicely under the efficient management of the present board of directors. Prof. J. C. Hardin is teaching the winter term and giving general satisfaction.
