

In the Postoffice Central Savings bank, in London, it has been found after two years' experience of electric lighting that the average amount of illness has been diminished by about two days per year for each person on the staff. This is equivalent to a gain to the service of the time of about eight clerks in that department alone. Taking the cost at the "overtime" rate only, this would mean a saving in salaries of £640 a year. The cost of the installation of the electric light was £3,349, and the annual cost of working £700 per annum, say a total annual sumed for lighting purposes was £700 a year, so that on the whole there was a direct saving of something like £266 a year to the government, besides the material advantage of the better work of the staff, resulting from the improved atmospheric conditions under which their work is done. - New York
