

LEBANON... ADAMS & ALEXANDER... TERMS OF SUBSCRIPTION... The force bill was practically killed in the Senate on Monday, the vote standing, yeas 44, nays 35.

Senator Ingalls was defeated by the Farmers' Alliance in Kansas Jan. 27. Pfeffer, formerly editor of the Kansas Farmer, will succeed Ingalls in the U. S. Senate.

Representative Minto says that the appropriations now before the Legislature aggregate more than all the revenue of the State, and recommends that all bills for wagon roads be scaled at least half.

Grover Cleveland, in a speech a short time since, urged the Democrats to stand firm on the fundamental principles of the party, and some one has suggested that if Cleveland would tell the people what these fundamental principles are, it would be very interesting.

It has been hinted that a certain class of our citizens have set their faces against every wagon-road bill, and are strongly opposed to appropriations of every kind. Such a position may argue a high order of statesmanship, but it certainly lacks the merit of good, common sense.

We would suggest that when Scio becomes the county-seat of Canada East she extend her southern limits so as to include the paper mill which is built somewhere between Lebanon and Scio. It is the institution a little; she refused Lebanon's embrace, but who knows but that she would affiliate with the Canadians.

Salvester Pennoyer, it is said, stands a better chance for the Senatorship than for the Presidency. Should there be as few mistakes in his second as in his first administration, his popularity may in time catch the ear of the Eastern democracy, but it will be a long time before Pacific presidential material is wanted in Washington. Gov. Pennoyer is the embodiment of frankness and honor, two qualities not particularly sought by either of the great political parties.

A bill has been introduced in the Legislature which contemplates the checking of a very prevalent vice, profanity. We doubt not that the bill originated in the best of motives, but it is more than doubtful if such a law would accomplish any good results. If the restraints growing out of an innate sense of decency and the common proprieties of society will not deter men from indulging a vice so detestable, legal enactments would serve no other purpose than to increase the swearer's vocabulary.

We endorse most heartily the Governor's recommendation to abolish the railroad commission, the fish commission and other offices which are created seemingly for the sole purpose of maintaining men who are not otherwise capable of earning a livelihood. We would go even farther and suggest that the money spent in maintaining these commissions be apportioned among that class of men who do more work and better work than many salaried officers; we allude to the various school boards throughout the country. These men lose much valuable time in guarding, fostering and perpetuating our educational institutions, and receive in return not an equivalent for their time, not a salary, but oftentimes abuse. Let us have fewer sinecures and pay these men, who really render a service to the country.
