The city ordinances of Lebanon should be gathered from the several corners of the earth, codified and published. Publish them.

It is a shame that a city of the importance of Lebanon should post its ordinances as do the villages of a few hundred people. Publish them.

A great throng of immigration is flocking to this coast. Lebanon is getting a share of the people settling in the valley; but ought to get more. Advertise more.

Governor Penoyer has been invited to address the Taunamy Hall democratic society, in New York, July 4. Declined on account of public duties at home.

Without any pre-arrangement of plans the monument of Jefferson Davis, at Jackson, Miss., and that of Gen. Grant, at Galena, Ills., were unveiled on the same day.

With the completion of the ditch new manufactures will come, more people will come. It will be necessary to erect many ordinances. Must the people be ignorant of them? Publish them.

A town to be prosperous must be backed by a country that is prolific in resources. Lebanon has all that is necessary in this particular to make her grow to many times her present size; and she goes forward all the time.

The commencement of work on the canal means a revival in all business departments. Its completion means the erection of manufacturing enterprises and the incalculable good of Lebanon. Vote for the bonds.

The people of Lebanon have the right to demand to know what the city fathers are doing. At present they must gather their only information from the ordinances as posted—if indeed they know where they are posted. Publish them.

Lebanon is a city that has doubled its population in a single year, and likely to do so again the present year, with no better means of publishing its laws than by p-o-s-t-a-l-g-r-a-m-s—called to the attention of our readers? Publish them.

Those persons most given to opposing public improvement, if you will observe, are usually those not the most successful in the management of their own affairs. They neither put their energy to the advancement of their own nor the public interest.

A Portland justice of the peace has decided that the election was illegal, and consequently refused to hold a prisoner for intimidating voters. Considerable fun is being poked at his honor, and the general opinion is that the new city officers will hold their positions in spite of this remarkable opinion.

Two years ago Lebanon was not as large a town nor had as flattering prospects as Stayton now has—Try, Bro. Lyon, to induce the good people to follow the example of our little city. But 35 new buildings in Stayton, in 18 months, as against 130 in Lebanon, in 12 months, to anybody but the faithful, ever-hopeful country editor, would be discouraging.

Ex-Senator Joseph E. McDonald is dead. He was a great democratic leader, and was popularly mentioned for the democratic nomination for the presidency when Grover Cleveland was chosen in 1884; he was elected to congress in 1849; in 1856 was elected attorney-general of Indiana; in 1864 was defeated for governor; and in 1875 was elected to the U. S. senate, serving one term. As a constitutional lawyer he ranked with Edmonds and Garland.

A special to the Statesman from St. Joseph Mo., dated June 22 says: The Missouri river is higher than for several years and is still rising. All the government works on the Kansas river, have been abandoned. The rapidity with which the surging waters are cutting away the Kansas bank can best be imagined when it is stated half acre lots have been tumbling into the river ever since yesterday morning. A workman, who came in from Belmont to-day, stated that the river, of land which separates the river north and south is less than a quarter of a mile wide. At the rate the river is now cutting the land away it would require but a short time to place the Etwood embank on the inland and leave St. Joseph ten miles from the river. This would also leave St. Joseph's 1,000,000 bridge standing over a dry spot where the river once wended its way south.

THE BOND ISSUE.

Lebanon's Best Interests Demand the Issue.

Shall we Bond the City for \$100,000?

Next Monday, June 29th the question whether or not we shall bond the town will be submitted to the legal voters of Lebanon. The issues as stated in a posted ordinance are, in substance, as follows:

First, to issue bonds for the sum of \$100,000. The money derived from the sale of such bonds to be used; First, for the purpose of securing, erecting and maintaining good and sufficient water works to supply said city with good and wholesome water—municipal and otherwise; Second, to build, manage and carry on gas and electric light systems for the supply of light to the city and its inhabitants; Third, for the construction and maintenance of a sewerage system; Fourth, to erect such city buildings as are necessary. All qualified electors in city limits may vote. Election 8 A. M. to 7 P. M.

A representative of the EXPRESS called upon some of the business men for an expression of their views with the following result: F. M. Miller: I am opposed to the proposition to bond the town, because it is unnecessary and an unwise course and will greatly increase taxation.

Hiram Baker: I am in favor of the proposition, and think the city should own its own water-works and light system.

G. T. Cotton: I will oppose the proposition as stated because I do not understand for what purpose this money is to be expended.

J. W. Mensie: I favor the issue of the bonds on account of the protection afforded the town from fire, with good water works. The city would derive a revenue from the investment.

Dr. L. Foley: We are now carrying \$3000 in bonds and I think it had policy to issue more. The ditch will come without the city going into this. I doubt if the city can legally do so. I probably have more than double the amount of stock held by any one else.

C. C. Haskaman: While I have not given the matter much thought you may put me down as being in favor of anything that will improve the growth of Lebanon. Good water power and water works no doubt is a good advantage to a place, hence I shall work and vote to bond the city next Monday.

S. W. Hinman: I am opposed to the proposition. Sufficient capital can be had without aid from the city to construct the ditch, and it will be put in without such aid. I think the city has it able to carry now.

E. E. Montague: I am in favor of bonding the city. I think the city should own its own water-works and light system.

M. A. Miller: I favor bonding the town. It is to the city's best interest to own its own water and lights. This will enable the city to forestall exorbitant charges for causing hereafter on the citizens, and besides they add to the enterprise of building a ditch and water works for the protection of the city.

Mayor J. A. Beard: Lebanon ought to own her own water and lights and I am heartily in favor of the issue of the bonds proposed. It will advance the best interest of the city.

Councilman G. W. Westfall: I am in favor of the enterprise because I think a perpetual water right for the city one of the greatest things the city could accomplish at this time; besides it will bring a revenue instead of increasing our taxes.

Councilman J. W. Cruson: Let Lebanon own her own water and lights. If there is money in them for others there is for the city.

W. D. Meservey: I am in favor of the building of the ditch, but I do not think Lebanon ought to coin \$100,000 in bonds. It is too heavy a tax upon so small a town.

Recorder W. C. Peterson: The bonds ought to issue. If it will pay others to own and operate water works and light plants it will pay Lebanon, rather than pay the charges; which may become exorbitant.

Swan Evans: The town ought to issue the bonds. Its best interests demand it. It will be cheaper to buy a franchise before the ditch comes than after.

P. M. Smith: I think it is best for the city to issue the bonds. The ditch will probably be put in any way, but I think the city gains an advantage by going into this enterprise.

S. P. Bach: I am in favor of bonding the town and think Lebanon ought to own its own water and light business.

In voting it should be borne in mind that if you favor issuing the bonds your ballot, should read "yes" if against it say "no"—or in other words you vote whole hog or none.

If you favor buying the water-right and are opposed to the main object, as we understand it, in issuing the bonds is that the city may put a sufficient amount of money in to secure the putting in of the ditch, and therefore acquire a water-right, perpetually.

Attend mass-meeting to-night. With Water-works, electric lights, sewerage system and public hall. Won't we put on ours. Vote for the bonds.
