A Big Prune Crop.

The harvest of the Willamette valley's prune crop for 1891 is just about finished, and from carefully prepared estimates it is judged to be perceptibly larger than last year's crop. Many new orchards are bearing this year for the first time and their product, added to the average crop in the old orchards brings the total output up to quite a handsome figure. The growing of prunes in Oregon is a success and their cultivation may be expected to increase from year to year for many years. Oregon prunes command good prices everywhere and they have thus far proven themselves a sure crop. Next year there will be five times as many pounds of prunes raised, say fruit men, as there were this year. The increased acreage will be bearing then, and the still newer orchards will have a few prunes on each tree.
