The court adjourned until Tuesday. The tax levy will probably be made about Wednesday. The rate will be the same as last year, 18 mills. The taxable property has been raised over a million dollars by the state board of equalization, but some additional funds are required, it is said, for the improvement of the jail and court house vault. If the board decides not to make these improvements this year, the rate may be lowered.
