Gen, Butler's Beath.

Gen. Benjamin F. Butler, lawyer, stolesmen, politician and million-aire manufacturer, died at his Washington residence, at half-post 1 o'clock Wednesday morning, Jan.

The General has been watching a case in the supreme court, on this coast, in which he was deeply interested, and which was decided against him, and very likely the loss of the case had some effect on his bealth.

His death created immense surprise as it was not even known he was alling. His death is said to have been from failure of heart action. Shortly after I o'clock in the morning he had a fit of coughing, and his expectoration was discolored with blood. He did not appear to think scriously of it, however, and after his valet had assisted him to his bed, said, "That's all, West, you need not de anything more," and apparently went to sleep. In a few moments, however, his heavy breathing again aroused alarm. It was fully fifteen minutes before aid could be secured, and then it was seen the General was already in "extremis," death onsuing almost immediately.

Later—A dispatch dated Jan. 17th states that the autopsy on the body of Gen. Butter showed the cause of death was the bursting of a small blood-vessel in the brain, caused by a violent fit of coughing. All the organs were in an excellent condition, and but for this accidental cause he would probably have lived many years. His brain weighes four ounces more than that of Daniel Weisster, one of the largest on record.
