Oregon moss is redeeming itself for all that has been said against it. A new industry has recently developed at Salem which promises to prove not only a valuable factor in itself, but an important matter for the railroads and shippers. The day has come when Oregon moss will enter into a new era. Already has a large amount been put in use. A company in Fresno has ordered a large invoice of Oregon moss to be shipped to them. When the moss arrives it is put to use in packing goods for shipment. Thursday five big bales of moss were shipped from Salem to Fresno, and yesterday another bale was shipped. This moss is collected and shipped by the Capital City nursery company of this city. That the moss is equal to other packing material is not questioned. No doubt in a year's time this new venture will be numbered among Oregon's chief and foremost industries. When packed and ready for shipment the moss is in bales and at first glance very much resembles hops.—Statesman.
