CITY ELECTION.

Once again the City Election is near at hand. On the 4th of December next the voters of the city will be called upon to choose their officers for the next year.

Neither the tariff nor the silver, the Chinese nor the Hawaiian question, will influence the voters. They will undoubtedly conduct this election, as all elections should be conducted, on strict business principles, giving their preference to the best men. At present the town seems to be peculiarly free from factions—political and otherwise. This is as it should be. Past experience has convinced us of the folly of bringing into elections questions of liquor and anti-liquor, church and anti-church. The people, of this place at least, have more than once demonstrated the fact that they will not be dominated by petty factions. Let men run on their merits for the offices, and not upon their supposed preference for this or that faction. Let "saints" and "sinners" vote for the best men—whether the best man happens to be a "saint" or a "sinner," as the voters have more than once been christened.
