The Pruning Pencil.

Prof. T. P. Hendrich, of the agricultural college at Corvallis, who is at the head of the horticultural department says:

"This is the time of year that the vine-borer gets in his work. The 'violet-pruner' with axes, saw and a pair of hedge shears, and other pruning tools down to insect stumps, is about offering his services. Orchardmen should give him a wide berth. This is applicable to all regions of Oregon, but the thought had best be suggested by the vine-borer workers returning from Southern Oregon who report overpriced orchards as about the worst feature of orcharding in that part of the state.

"A healthy tree well headed at the start, the head twenty or thirty inches from the ground, needs only to have deformed, crooked and crossed limbs removed, with saw and then a branch taken out to thin out the top. The shape of the tree must be governed by pruning and removing small twigs with a budding knife. All other pruning is unnecessary and wasteful destruction that seriously impairs the vital and usefulness of the tree."
