#### EARHART MUNS AMUCK.

Last Friday evening after the people at the Ione Hotel went to the dance at the skating rink, Chas Earhart, who has been clerk at the hotel since Mrs Ganger took possession, the first of June, became angered about family differences of opinion, and undertock to do Mrs Ganger bodily harm. She was able, with the aid of Mr Waite. auditor of the Wind River Lumber Company, who was in his roon up stairs, to ward off Earhart. Mrs Ganger and Earliart then went to the dance, and after a dance together, Earhart became quarelsom and told Mrs Ganger and the child ren to go home. They refused and he left the building in great angor and meeting Henry Clark, son-inlaw of Mrs Ganger, started to cut him with a knife. Mrs Canger arrived in time to rush between them and get the revolver Clark drew, who fired five shots at Ear-hart, all of which went wild Ear-hart then broke into the store of the C'T Walker estate, and turned on the lights and secured a supply of ammunition and a shot-gun, He left through the back door and intercepted Mrs Ganger, and her children, who had concluded they had better go home, and at the point of a shot-gun forced them to go up the railmad track and across to the Hotel. The men of the town were seemingly stunned and a-Earhart had many times said be had it in for a number of them for past conditions, there was a great many of them "hunting holes." However after a time a number entered Walker's and the Woolery Hardware stores and got revolvers guns and ammunition, and some went to their homes for guns, and a man hunt began in earnest. Ear hart cause down town and sented himself before the Chick Pharnmey and called Harry Reed to him and used him as a shield from the crowd. Ed Ball and Jee Cropan went into the Bank and Ball fired three times at Earhart across the street and through the window, breaking the large plate glass. All three shots went wild but caused toward the blacksmith shop a in the one block. All went wild and he started for the hills and as he passed the warehouse, an old man, who was sleeping there, in the grass, raised on his albow to tell the men Earhart had gone, and one of the pursuers thought it was the man they wanted and shot him in the shoulder, the shot lodging under the left shoulder blade. hart safely secured himself in the hills and kept off the men until daybreak, when for some reason his nerve failed him, and he cam out and surrendered and plead for mercy as the citizens showed him there was great danger of a lynching party. Deputy Sheriff Cason assisted by three other men hurrid him into a buggy and started to Heppner but at Lexington met Sheriff Shutt, who had been notifi-ed by Walter Puyear and H L Jones, who made the drive in one
