THE KNEEL OF THE WEED.

Long and earnestly have the experts
of the Department of Agriculture
been striving to find some means
of eradicating the weed, other than
by grubbing or pulling it up, and
news comes from North Dakota
that the fight has been won—at
least over the wild mustard, the
Canada thistle, the dandelion and
many other similar pest abominations
of people who till the ground for
a living.

Spraying the territory affected
with a solution of iron sulphate
when the weeds are young does the
work. The chemical, which is
corrosive, attacks the tender tissue
of the rapidly growing weeds and
destroys them while there is little
or no injury to the grain, particularly
if it is a winter grain or was sown
early in the spring and has gained
considerable growth before the
spraying—American Farmer.
